The meeting of Association for Harm reduction Education & Research (AHRER) was convened on 24.06.2020 at **-7.00 PM-08.00 PM on web portal of Google Meet**. The members discussed the following issues:

1. **Review of May minutes:** A very brief review of the previous month minutes was done by Dr. Sre and invited Prof. Sharan to share ideas about sources of funding.

## 2. Presentation by Prof. Sharan: Funding and Regulatory Compliance

- 1. Regulatory Compliance-AHRER should maintain 100 percent compliance with regulatory guidelines in its application for funding.
- 2. Fund raising-aimed through membership fees, personal donations, philanthropy contributions, IT deductions through organizations (Obtain Section12-A/88-A certificates) etc.
- 3. AHRER can apply for funding through research grant applications to ICMR/MOHFW/Ministry of Home Affairs etc

## 3. Presentation by Dr. Desai: Conflict of Interest

- 1. Pharmaceutical companies and single product promotion (Pfizer, Varenicline) may not be considered at this point of time.
- Tobacco Industry funded Foundations or CSR initiatives and their funding source/scoping of work at the level of the organization and individual capacity with complete independent autonomy and noninfluence in the work is a complex issue which is parked for further indepth discussions at a later meeting.
- 3. 3-Prong-strategy-Funding sources:
  - i. Non-tobacco industry-CSR-to be leveraged.
  - ii. BIG MONEY-Premji Foundation, Tata Trust, Mahindra Foundation (Dr. Vikas Jain) to be leveraged.
  - iii. Nobel-Laureate-Kailash Satyarthi (Regranting Organizations)-Explore: Harm reduction in Children and Youth to be explored personally.

- 4. Dr. Vikas highlighted the conflict of interest involved in studies related to ENDS which might have remote connections to industry funding and thus might be discredited.
- 5. Mr. Samrat shared the extreme limitations involved in the current THR funding landscape and impressed on the importance of continuing the global collective work through partnerships with multiple stakeholders.
- 6. **Recap and Closure:** After a quick recap by Dr. Sre, all members thanked our mentors Prof. Sharan and Dr. Desai for a stimulating discussion tonight and requested to guide us to follow-up the funding sources mentioned in the call.
